FROM THE DESK OF RABBI SAUL

I want to share with you a letter from Cousin Josh Strosberg...

For the past three years, I have had the privilege of celebrating Rosh Hashana at Sherith Israel and enjoying the warmth and friendliness of the Nashville community. So, it was with hesitation that I made plans to travel to Uman, Ukraine to spend this Rosh Hashana at the grave of Rebbe Nachman of Bratslav. I knew I would be missing Cantor's musaf and Rabbi Saul's shofar and the post-tashlich party at Louis and Sylvia's...but something inexplicable was drawing me to Rebbe Nachman.

And here's something even more inexplicable: Rebbe Nachman died in 1811 at the age of 38 from tuberculosis. A great-grandson of the Baal Shem Tov, his life sparked controversy, the non-chassidic community lambasted him, and he was shunned even by most of the Chassidic Rebbes themselves. At the time of his death, he had no more than a few hundred followers. He left no successor. Two hundred years later, in 2010, approximately 25,000 Jews from all walks of life made a pilgrimage to his gravesite to celebrate Rosh Hashana.

How do you explain this?

My theory is that Rebbe Nachman discovered one of the most significant finds of the millennium. He found the "Type O" blood of the Jewish People. He excavated spiritual practices that transcended religious denomination, nationality, even time.

For instance, he spoke frequently about the need to have a "conversation" with God on a daily basis, to set aside time to be alone and speak about "stuff": frustrations and accomplishments, fears and desires, the family member that ticked you off this morning, or that test that you need a good grade on. And he said to speak bluntly and truthfully, without any inhibitions. I picture it like speaking as you would to a therapist or a bartender. Which one of us, religious or secular, chareidi or Open Orthodox, couldn't use that?

And he said to actually talk to God during the course of the day; as well, asking for things as they come up, letting Him into your life, forging a practical organic relationship with Him.

I experienced this type of spontaneous prayer first-hand in Ukraine. After landing in Kiev, I took a three-hour van ride south to Uman. I was traveling alone. David, the guy who was arranging my accommodations, was supposed to meet me at a particular spot on the main street in Uman between 10 and 11 pm, and from there he would take me to the apartment. Of course the van driver gets lost and I don't get to Uman until 11:30. The only thing David knows about my appearance is that I'm carrying a big orange hiking backpack. David had given me a vague address of the apartment in case we missed each other but I really would not have been able to find it at night, as streets are not clearly labeled. I get a little apprehensive being in a strange country with people that I don't know. Uman is on a hill and as I am walking up, amidst a sea of thousands of other pilgrims, I hear someone say "Josh?" It was David and he spotted my orange backpack. He immediately told me that he was davening to Hashem that he would somehow find me.

Another example of Rebbe Nachman’s universal teachings which reach across the spectrum is his emphasis on Simcha, joy. He says one should “force” oneself to be happy, even if it means resorting to doing silly things. Each person has a different funny button. I, personally, am well stocked with Marx Brothers and Three Stooges routines in my head that I can replay at will – they always get me to crack up.

In Uman I had meager accommodations – there were fourteen of us staying in a medium size room! Several of my Yom Tov and Shabbos meals consisted of the sardines, pita and granola bars that I had shlepped in my backpack. (It was the first three-day Yom Tov where I actually lost weight!) But I really didn’t care – I was around people who were so imbued with simcha and optimism about the coming year that it overrode any physical discomfort I was experiencing.

There is much more to say about Uman and Rebbe Nachman. One veteran pilgrim who has been going to Uman for Rosh Hashana even during the Soviet regime, told me that you don’t begin to understand what happened to you until six months later. So I will update you then. But as I said before, there were representatives in Uman from so many different countries and walks of life, but as far as I could tell there was no representative from Nashville – something to think about for next year...

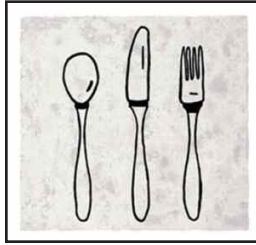


TWO EXCITING TRIPS TO ISRAEL

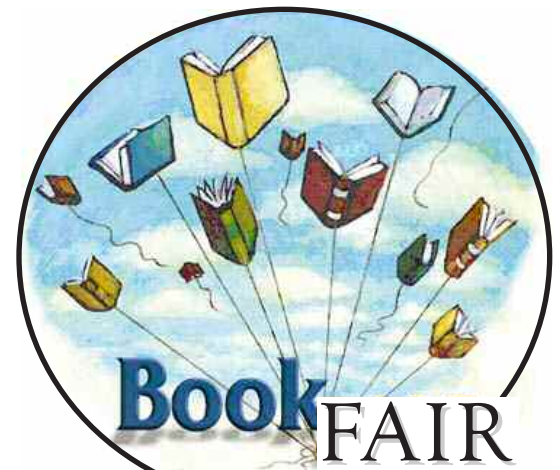

New care manager reaches out to older adults needing assistance with flood recovery

FiftyForward is a nonprofit Middle Tennessee agency that enriches the lives of adults 50+ by providing pathways to health, well-being and lifelong learning.

Four out of five of our Davidson County centers are located in areas hard hit by the May flooding: in Bellevue, Madison, Donelson and Bordeaux.

As older adults can have difficulty accessing resources due to lack of transportation, fewer using computers, and physical and cognitive challenges, **FiftyForward** is reaching out to them by providing flood recovery assistance. FEMA data shows that one out of every five Tennesseans affected by the May floods is at least 60 years old. In Davidson County, 4,782 individuals 60+ sustained damages. FEMA has paid out maximum grants for \$29,900 to 210 Davidson County residents who are over 60.

With the support of The Melkus Foundation, HCA Foundation and Piedmont Natural Gas, Stephany Gleadall has been hired as a Flood Recovery Care Manager. She received her bachelor's of science degree in social work from Middle Tennessee State University. Stephany is employed full-time for one year to reach out solely to those 50+ affected by the floods. She will meet with individuals wherever they are currently staying, be it their own home or a temporary one. She will travel to neighboring counties, as necessary, to reach those who were affected in Davidson and Williamson Counties, the area served by **FiftyForward**.

Stephany can help with FEMA appeals, ongoing FEMA documentation, "We are Home" applications, securing household goods and other items lost in the flood, plus legal, medical, mental health, housing, and financial issues. Stephany said, "Rebuilding one's home and life following a flood can be extremely complex, confusing and challenging. My role is to simplify the process, complete the legwork necessary to make recovery possible and timely, and to help those 50+ know what their options are." 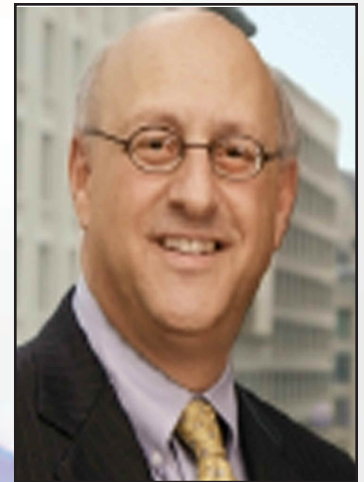

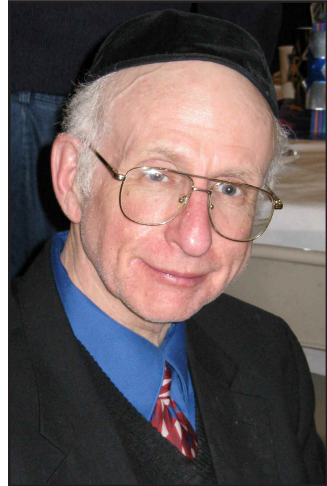
