From the Desk of Rabbi Saul Strosberg



JETS MOVE YOM KIPPUR GAME UP

After outcry from the Jets and their Jewish fans, the NFL agreed to move the time of their September 27 game from 4:15 p.m. to 1 p.m. This way, fans will be able to get home before sundown and the start of Yom Kippur, the Jewish

day of atonement. Some fans may be atoning for attending the September 20th afternoon game—which falls during Rosh Hashanah! The Giants are playing on the road during the two holidays, after the NFL agreed to Big Blue's request to avoid playing during Jewish holidays at home (the NY market has a lot of Jewish fans); the NFL, however, admitted it made a mistake scheduling the Jets to play at home even though the team requested otherwise. What a great message! The NFL changes its schedule in deference to Yom Kippur. The “take away” couldn’t be more straightforward – if the New York Jets can modify their schedule for Yom Kippur, so can we. For many of us, football games are important, but they can be taped and watched later. Encounters with the Divine cannot be rescheduled. The NFL understands this and so must we!

As we approach Shavuot, the final Festival of the year, let us take it upon ourselves to be present when it matters most. This includes davening at Shul, visiting the sick, comforting the bereaved, celebrating smachot, and being there for others in times of need. Each of us counts and each of us has infinite value to contribute to our people.

Did anyone notice the following irony in this past week’s Torah reading? Moshe tells Aharon, “Al Yavo Bichol et el HaKodesh.” You can’t just come before God however you please. Rather, when you come before God, you must wear specific garments, the *Bigdei Kehunah*, designed for the High Priest.

Here is Moshe commanding Aaron to dress himself in these fancy, royal type garments as he approached God. But how did Moshe himself approach God? “*Shaal Nalechah MeAl Raglechah.*” Moshe had to remove his shoes before coming near the burning bush. Removing shoes is the epitome of modesty and humility. So here we have Moshe who approaches God in a modest and humble way, with a lack of clothing, while he commands Aaron to only approach God when he is dressed like a king.

These two great religious leaders had two almost opposite paths toward God. One chose a path through modesty and humility and the other a path through dedication and consecration of material goods for God.

It reminds me that however we dress, and whatever our emphasis (whether it be external modesty, or consecration of material goods) what matters most is that our paths lead us to the right place.

HOUSING GRANT

An exciting new grant has been funded in Nashville to assist those in the Jewish community wishing to purchase housing off of West End, near Sherith Israel and West End synagogues.

The goal of the grant is to build and concentrate the Jewish community around the synagogues, and will focus on placing families and individuals in the brand new West End Condos, luxury 1, 2 & 3 bedroom homes off Blakemore and West End (www.thewestend-condos.com). They are a few blocks walking distance from Sherith Israel and a mile from West End Synagogue. The non-profit managing the funds, has committed to granting 50% of the purchase price on any of the 60 listings at the aforementioned property. This would put entry price at \$200k, on the \$400-\$2million units.

Requirements to qualify for the funds are simple; with the desire to live/own a home in the area as the primary. These funds are not loans, but grants, and although there is no mandatory attendance required at services, it is the hope!

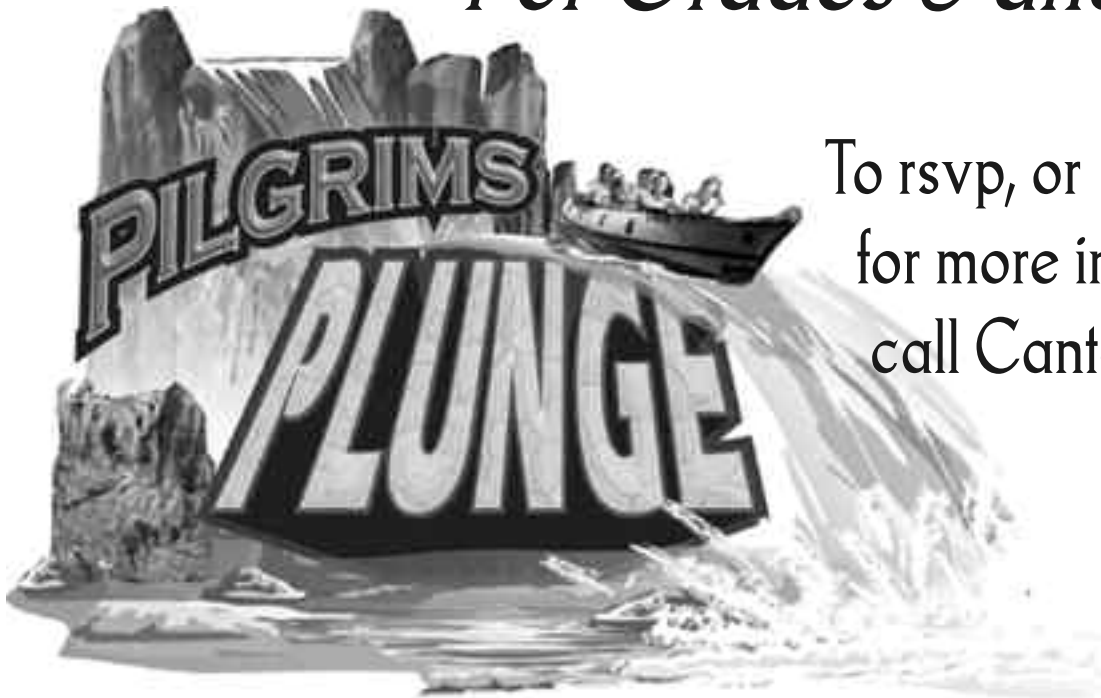

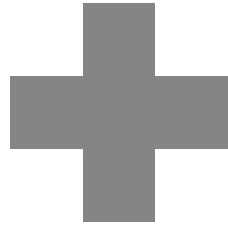
